| II. Presentation: Wyonette Cheairs, Lead Safe Cleveland Coalition |  |  |

| Discussion | -The coalition was launched in January 2019 to address lead poisoning in children in the <br> Coints | City of Cleveland. This is in response to $25 \%$ of children in Cleveland with elevated lead <br> levels prior to kindergarten and the recognition for a need for a comprehensive solution. <br> The Cleveland approach to this effort is a customization of science and best practice <br> approaches from other efforts across the country. The coalition is coordinated by <br> Enterprise Community Partners, as has a steering committee of 17 members and 7 |

|  | subcommittees. One of the biggest initial wins has been the adoption of lead safe law by <br> Cleveland City Council. This legislation applies to rental properties and landlords in the <br> City of Cleveland. Included in the law are requirements for properties to be certified lead <br> safe by March 2023, creates Lead Safe Auditor position, establishes a lead safe advisory <br> board, the creation of the lead safe home fund, which includes a lead safe resource <br> center and lead safe home loan and grant program. The effort focuses on lead safe <br> environments vs. lead-free environments. <br> - ECE implications: Child care programs were not included in the initial legislation and <br> there are in fact licensed programs with lead hazards providing childcare services to <br> children. The coalition is in the process of starting 2 subcommittees of the coalition's <br> policy working group: ECE Screening and Testing, which will focus on increasing screening <br> and testing for children ages 0-2; and Lead-Safe Standards, which will look at existing <br> licensing standards and rules and seek opportunities in licensing to include lead <br> standards. |

| Conclusion/ | EAHS members find value in leveraging opportunities between both coalitions. EAHS will <br> work on generating a list of talking points/ECE efforts that the coalition recommends the <br> Lead Safe group consideration. Initial ideas on this include more on-site testing at ECE |
| facilities to increase screening rates; integrate lead policies and nutrition opportunities |  |
