In 2012, **38,000**

children ages 0-5 spent time in early learning environments in Cuyahoga County.





On average, young children spend

32 hours a week

> in an early learning environment.





Five year olds who have a healthy weight are

4 times less likely

to become obese teens than five year olds who are overweight.


To work *together* to create healthy environments for young children in Cuyahoga County.

Recap of November's Meeting

- Cleveland Central Promise Neighborhood (CCPN) started in 2010 with the goal of ensuring that children and their families are resilient, thriving, and receive a quality education.
- The number of quality childcare programs in the CCPN has steadily risen, with 9 highly rated centers, the majority of whom are also designated as Ohio Healthy Programs.
- CCPN also provides other supportive services for young children and families, including memberships to the Children's Museum, Read and Ride, SPARK home visiting, and the Imagination Library. CCPN also supports the K-12 system through scholarship support, trauma-informed care training, and high school transition.



2020 Survey – where is working happening with EAHS members




EAHS Working Groups - Draft
