I. Review of Prioritization Exercise	
Discussion Points	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review of prioritization table and all of the measures and strategies that were considered by the group. • Performance Measures (PM) that emerged: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ % change in KRA scores as a result of COVID-19 ○ # of programs opting into the use of social emotional assessment tools ○ # of providers having social emotional awareness built into their programming • Strategies that emerged: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Provide roadmap to social emotional resources for families (ties to PM 1) ○ Support ECE professionals in regards to their own social emotional health (ties to PM 2) • Discussion <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Hard to see connection between KRA measure and strategies. Focus on KRA could be challenging for several reasons: focus becomes on academics; access to KRA data; connection to KRA and work of coalition could be tough; KRA does not fully demonstrate a child’s readiness from a social emotional health perspective; KRA scores will be skewed for several reasons. ○ Other performance measures are output and not outcome measures – what do they change for the child?

II. Performance Measure and Strategy Discussion - #1	
Discussion Points	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider changing language in performance measure to screening tools vs. assessment tools. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ DECA training is available throughout the county for programs ○ Starting Point collects DECA data twice a year. • Strategy #1 – need to define what we mean by social emotional health. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Some do it all day long, some programs layer in curriculum by not all.
Conclusion/ Actions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Alison to work on drafting new language for measure.

III. Performance Measure and Strategy # 2	
Discussion Points	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Performance measure – Process measure consideration: How many programs are offering curriculum and/or training their staff? Consider creating survey looking at number of hours of training provided; connection to parents, what has the impact been on children, families, etc? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Can play into a cultural shift – what a classroom looks like; what is the internally programming in place? Could help to define what the characteristics of success are that result in better outcomes for kids. • Strategy: Really important – cannot be successful in helping kids if we are not helping the staff. A roadmap for professionals could be helpful. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Survey can be generated to understand what trainings and resources are available and promoted to staff. ○ Locally there is a lot of work going on around compassion fatigue and secondary trauma for ECE professionals. ○ The Greater Cleveland Families Strengthening Network is a fairly new organization. They are having a self-care webinar coming up.
